Tell the truth.

We don't lie. We try not to say untruthful things. If we think the truth is too shocking, we find a skillful and loving way to tell the truth.

Sometimes even the most skillful words cause pain. That is okay. Pain can heal. If your words are spoken with compassion and understanding, the pain will heal more quickly.

Don't exaggerate.

Sometimes we make something seem very tragic to justify and even feed anger. In exaggerating what the other has done, you paint a wrong image. This may seem harmless, but it takes you away from the truth and takes away the trust in a relationship.

- In Vietnamese, **a "forked tongue"** means you say something to one person, but to another person you say something different as a way of gaining some advantage.
- **Right Speech requires being true to your word** and not changing the content for your own advantage or to portray yourself in a better light.

Use peaceful language.

Speak the language of the world.

We have to use **the kind of language that people speak** and the way they view things.

If you don't use the language of the world, most people won't understand what you mean, and you can communicate only with people who already think like you.

Speak according to the understanding of the listener.

- We need to keep the truthful content the same while being aware of the perspective and understanding of the person we're speaking to, so **others have an opportunity to really hear what's being said.**
- You have to look deeply at the person to see how they perceive, and speak in a way that takes that into account.

The Four CRITERIA of Loving Speech from Thích Nhất Hạnh

Give the right teaching according to person, time, and place.

Think of how to make the truths you hear resonate with your own. If you were to give another person exactly the teaching you heard, it might not be the appropriate teaching for that person. We want to share information in a way that people can integrate and use later, even if not right away. Meet people where they are. Teach in a way that reflects the absolute truth.

- "Absolute truth" = the most profound view of things
- We have to be humble and try to look more and more deeply to discover in what way we can talk about these complex, nuanced, difficult truths.
